

Airport Operating/Capital Millage

City of Holland / West Michigan Airport Authority

Shall the 17.5 mill tax rate limitation, upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property for all purposes in any one (1) year under the charter of the City of Holland, Ottawa and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be increased for the City of Holland by 1/10th of a mill (\$.10 for each \$1,000 of the taxable value of all property) for a period of five (5) years, beginning in the 2008 calendar year, and ending December 31, 2012, for the purposes of supporting the planning, promoting, acquiring, constructing, improving, enlarging, extending, owning, maintaining, and operating the landing/navigational and building facilities of the Tulip City Airport by the West Michigan Airport Authority formed by a Resolution and Agreement among the City of Holland, the Charter Township of Holland, the Township of Park, and the City of Zeeland? If approved and levied in its entirety in the first calendar year of authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$121,650.00.

Airport Operating/Capital Millage

City of Zeeland / West Michigan Airport Authority

Shall the 15 mill tax rate limitation, upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property for all purposes in any one (1) year under the Charter of the City of Zeeland, Ottawa County, Michigan, be increased for the City of Zeeland by 1/10th of a mill (\$.10 for each \$1,000 of the taxable value of all property) for a period of five (5) years, beginning in the 2008 calendar year, and ending December 31, 2012, for the purposes of supporting the planning, promoting, acquiring, constructing, improving, enlarging, extending, owning, maintaining, and operating the landing/navigational and building facilities of the Tulip City Airport by the West Michigan Airport Authority formed by a Resolution and Agreement among the City of Holland, the Charter Township of Holland, the Township of Park, and the City of Zeeland? (If approved and levied in its entirety in the first calendar year of authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$42,891.)

Airport Operating/Capital Millage

Holland Charter Township / West Michigan Airport Authority

Shall the charter township tax rate limitation, upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property for all purposes in any one year under Michigan law be increased for the Charter Township of Holland, Ottawa County, Michigan, by 1/10th of a mill (\$.10 for each \$1,000 of the taxable value of all property) for a period of five (5) years, beginning in the 2008 calendar year, and ending December 31, 2012, for the purposes of supporting the planning, promoting, acquiring, constructing, improving, enlarging, extending, owning, maintaining, and operating the landing/navigational and building facilities of the Tulip City Airport by the West Michigan Airport Authority formed by a Resolution and Agreement among the City of Holland, the Charter Township of Holland, the Township of Park, and the City of Zeeland? If approved and levied in its entirety in the first calendar year of authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$134,000.00.

Airport Operating/Capital Millage

Park Township / West Michigan Airport Authority

Shall the 15 mill limitation, upon the total amount of general ad valorem taxes imposed upon real and tangible personal property for all purposes in any one year under Michigan Law be increased for the Township of Park, Ottawa County, Michigan, by 1/10th of a mill (\$.10 for each \$1,000 of the taxable value of all property) for a period of five (5) years, beginning in the 2008 calendar year, and ending December 31, 2012, for the purposes of supporting the planning, promoting, acquiring, constructing, improving, enlarging, extending, owning, maintaining, and operating the landing/navigational and building facilities of the Tulip City Airport by the West Michigan Airport Authority formed by a Resolution and Agreement among the City of Holland, the Charter Township of Holland, the Township of Park, and the City of Zeeland? If approved and levied in its entirety in the first calendar year of authorization, this millage would raise an estimated \$90,150.00.

Community Swimming Pool Millage Proposition - Renewal

(This millage would renew the previous .85 mill levy, which expired in 2007, for the operation of the Holland Community Aquatic Center.)

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property (both homestead and non-homestead) in the Holland Area Community Swimming Pool Authority (whose geographic boundaries are coterminous with those of the Holland School District) be increased in the amount of .85 mills (\$.85 on each \$1,000) on taxable value for a period of three (3) years, 2008 through 2010, inclusive, to provide funds to enable the Authority to own, operate, and maintain a community swimming pool and shall the Authority be authorized to levy said tax? If this millage is approved and levied, it is estimated that it will result in a revenue increase of \$1,055,414 being collected by the Authority in the 2008 calendar year.

Allendale Public Schools-

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal (Excluding Principal Residence And Other Exempt Property)

(This millage will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-principal residence and other non-exempt property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.)

Shall an expiring increase in the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting therefrom principal residence property and other property exempt by law, in Allendale Public School, Ottawa County, Michigan, be renewed in the amount of 18.0 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000.00) on taxable value for one (1) year, 2008, to provide funds for school operating purposes? If this millage is approved and levied, it is estimated that revenue in the amount of \$1,843,000 will be collected by the School District in the first year.

Coopersville Area Public Schools-

OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Coopersville Area Public Schools, Ottawa and Muskegon Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of

taxable valuation) for the year 2008, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2008 is approximately \$1,792,605 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2007 tax levy)?

Grand Haven Area Public Schools –

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal (Excluding Principal Residence And Other Exempt Property)

(This millage will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-principal residence and other non-exempt property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.)

Shall an expiring increase in the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting therefrom principal residence property and other property exempt by law, in Grand Haven Area Public Schools, Ottawa and Muskegon Counties, Michigan, be renewed in the amount of 18.0 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000.00) on taxable value for one (1) year, 2008, to provide funds for school operating purposes? If this millage is approved and levied, it is estimated that revenue in the amount of \$17,722,740 will be collected by the School District in the first year.

Holland Public Schools -

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal (Excluding Principal Residence And Other Exempt Property)

(This millage will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-principal residence and other non-exempt property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.)

Shall an expiring increase in the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting therefrom principal residence property and other property exempt by law, in School District of the City of Holland, Ottawa and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be renewed in the amount of 18.0 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000.00) on taxable value for one (1) year, 2008, to provide funds for school operating purposes? If this millage is approved and levied, it is estimated that revenue in the amount of \$11,188,600 will be collected by the School District in the first year.

Hudsonville Public Schools –

OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Hudsonville Public Schools, Ottawa and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for the year 2008, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue

the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2008 is approximately \$4,900,000 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2007 tax levy)?

MILLAGE PROPOSAL, BUILDING AND SITE SINKING FUND TAX LEVY

This proposal renews building and site sinking fund millage that expired with the 2007 tax levy and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property in Hudsonville Public Schools, Ottawa and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be increased by and the board of education be authorized to levy 1 mill (\$1.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of 5 years, 2008 to 2012, inclusive, for sinking fund purposes to be used for the purchase of real estate for sites for, and the construction or repair of, school buildings and all other purposes authorized by law (.9793 mill of the above is a renewal of millage for building and site sinking fund purposes which expired with the 2007 tax levy and .0207 mill is to restore millage for the same purpose lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963); the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2008 is approximately \$1,200,000?

Spring Lake Public Schools –

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal (Excluding Principal Residence And Other Exempt Property)

(This millage will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-principal residence and other non-exempt property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.)

Shall an expiring increase in the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting therefrom principal residence property and other property exempt by law, in Spring Lake Public Schools, Ottawa County, Michigan, be renewed in the amount of 18.0 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000.00) on taxable value for one (1) year, 2008, to provide funds for school operating purposes? If this millage is approved and levied, it is estimated that revenue in the amount of \$2,959,105 will be collected by the School District in the first year.

West Ottawa Public Schools –

Operating Millage Renewal Proposal (Excluding Principal Residence And Other Exempt Property)

(This millage will allow the School District to levy not more than the statutory rate of 18 mills against non-principal residence and other non-exempt property required for the School District to receive its revenue per pupil foundation guarantee.)

Shall an expiring increase in the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, excepting therefrom principal residence property and other property exempt by law, in School District of West Ottawa Public Schools, Ottawa County, Michigan, be renewed in the amount of 18.0 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000.00) on taxable value for one (1) year, 2008, to provide funds for school operating purposes? If this millage is approved and levied, it is

estimated that revenue in the amount of \$13,925,671 will be collected by the School District in the first year.

Zeeland Public Schools –

OPERATING MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This proposal will allow the school district to continue to levy the statutory rate of 18 mills on all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, required for the school district to receive its revenue per pupil foundation allowance.

Shall the limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property, except principal residence and other property exempted by law, in Zeeland Public Schools, Ottawa and Allegan Counties, Michigan, be increased by 18 mills (\$18.00 on each \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for the year 2008, to provide funds for operating purposes; the estimate of the revenue the school district will collect if the millage is approved and levied in 2008 is approximately \$7,548,983 (this is a renewal of millage which expired with the 2007 tax levy)?
