New Recreation Software -Getting Started with WebTrac

WebTrac is our new online registration system. This system will allow you to register online for programs, reserve a facility, and much more. To enroll in programs or book a reservation, you'll need to create an online account in WebTrac with a unique username and password.

How do I create an account?

- 1. Visit miottawacountyweb.myvscloud.com
- 2. Click Sign in/Register in the top right corner.
- 3. Select "Don't have an account? Sign Up Now."
- 4. Enter required information highlighted in red.
- 5. Add family members.
- 6. Click "I'm not a Robot" and then Save.
- 7. Check your inbox for a verification email.

What will happen to my PerfectMind account?

Your previous account with us in PerfectMind will be closed and any associated information will be deleted. You MUST create a new account in WebTrac to register for programs and book a reservation.

Rosy Mound Expansion

Lake Michigan Coastal Greenway

Progress continues toward a possible 127-acre expansion of the 164acre Rosy Mound Natural Area. In December 2023, the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Board recommended a second grant of \$1,642,000 to assist with funding the acquisition.

The 127-acre property is a former sand mine to the northeast of Rosy Mound and has been a high priority target for the Parks Commission since the first parks plan in 1989. This property features 108 acres of designated critical dune. If acquired, it would create a 291-acre park and potentially double the size of the hiking trail system. Beyond a trail system expansion to ensure access and protect sensitive features, other uses for the expanded area are yet to be determined. Following the possible acquisition, a public master plan update process would be undertaken.

Other Discounted Permits

Active Bridge Card holders in Michigan can receive a free Ottawa County Parks annual motor vehicle permit. Limited to one permit per household.





Expanding Horizons Along the Macatawa Greenway


Macatawa River Greenway

Several projects are underway to further develop and connect the Macatawa Greenway. A key area of focus lies between Hawthorn Pond and Upper Macatawa Natural Area, where Macatawa Greenway partners have acquired the necessary land to create a continuous route between both parks.

In coordination with Holland Township and the ODC Network, plans include establishing a 2.1-mile natural surface trail through Poppen Woods, Middle Macatawa, and 96th Avenue properties, with bridge crossings over the Macatawa River to enhance connectivity for trail users. The goal is to complement this trail expansion with amenities such as a trailhead and modern restroom at Hawthorn Pond.

In December 2023, the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Board proposed a \$300,000 grant to support this project. Detailed engineering work is set to begin this spring, with construction likely starting in late 2024 or early 2025. Thanks to the support of our generous donors, the Ottawa County Parks Foundation enjoyed a successful year.

The Ottawa County Parks Foundation is an independent 501(c)3 non-profit organization formed to benefit the Ottawa County Parks and Recreation Commission. The Foundation relies on private donations and grants to do its work.

Some of the projects funded by the Parks Foundation in 2023:

- Supported parks programs in 2023 that connected over 1,000 people with nature.
- Thanks to a grant from the Grand Haven Area Community Foundation, the Parks Commission completed a Parks for All pilot with 4th graders at Grand Haven, Spring Lake, Coopersville, and Allendale Schools. The Parks Foundation provided the matching funds for the grant.
- Improved accessibility in Ottawa County Parks by providing spaces for those with reduced mobility levels to rest.
