SUBJECT: DISCUSSION ITEMS

Senior Care Coordinators Meeting Results – Pam Curtis reported a variety of service providers meet in September to discuss gaps in services available to older adults in Ottawa County. The top five gaps identified were: 1) Support Coordination, 2) Assistant with Paper Work, 3) Transportation, 4) Mental Health Services, and 5) MiChoice Waiver. Transportation turned out to be the number one problem. Ottawa County is the fastest growing County in the Senior Resources Region. The senior population is at 18% now and expected to be 30% within 5 years. Georgetown, Hudsonville and Grandville are in talks and looking at possibly starting a senior center.

Funding continues to be an issue but this is not a good time to look at a millage.

2. Department Reports:

Human Services Coordinating Counsel – Donna Cornwell reported on the Homeless Youth Forum that was held yesterday. There were 45 participates and four homeless youths spoke. Schools discussed how to better identify these youths.

Mental Health – Lynne Doyle updated the Committee on the dual eligibility issues. This Friday, six counties will be holding a forum on Health Care Reform and how to prepare.

MI Works!/CAA – Bill Raymond updated the Committee on the Prisoner Re-Entry Program, utility issues and weatherization. He reported they received word yesterday that the Tax Assistance Money will be coming through.

150 graduates and seniors attended the Workforce Development event on October 28th for 300 jobs. A similar event will be held for blue collar workers. Continental Dairy had over 900 applicants show up for 47 open positions.

Health Department – Dr. Heidel reported it is Norovirus season again. There has been one reported outbreak in Hudsonville. The Health Department received a report that a doctor in Ottawa County is treating 54 people for Lyme disease but none are meeting the criteria. This is out of the Health Department's control but they have reported this to the State. This is bothersome because people are being treated for something they don't have. Not sure if the 54 can be contacted because of HIPPA laws. This would be something Corporate Counsel would have to look into.

Lisa Stefanovsky reported there are some Environmental Health situations going on. The Field Services staff is swamped. Lisa stated they the Health Dept. has received a lot of positive feedback on the Water Quality Forum that was held.

Human Services – Michelle Martin reported utility assistance has been cut 50% this year which is going to make for a tough winter. For now, the Cash Assistance time limits are in effect. Michelle also reported an increase from 43% to 66% in CPS cases with the centralized intake in place.

3. The December Health & Human Services Meeting will be canceled.



- ✓ Reduce time that DHS staff spend answering phone calls average caseload size is 469 in Ottawa County.
- ✓ Reduce number of recipient local office visits.
- ✓ Give citizens anywhere, anytime access to apply for DHS programs.
- ✓ Allow DHS recipients to get answers to commonly asked questions themselves through the Internet and telephone.
- ✓ Build on the success of existing MI Bridges (As of November 2nd 2011)
 - Over 418,000 applications submitted online
 - Over 682 registered community partners
 - Over 450,390 online recipient accounts created
 - Over 52,670 case change reports submitted
 - Over 1,250,000 telephone calls received

MI Bridges Expansion



MI Bridges provides DHS clients the ability to interact with the DHS via a self-service website and an interactive voice response (IVR) system.

MI Bridges – New Functionality



- ✓ View All Program Status Allow the case owner (head of household) to view benefit status for:
 - Cash Assistance
 - Child Development and Care
 - Food Assistance
 - Medical Assistance
 - State Emergency Relief
- Access Control Allow the case owner (head of household) to grant case viewing permissions online to any case member.
- Correspondence Allow recipients to view their correspondence electronically.
- ✓ Electronic Notification Allow recipients to receive emails when new correspondence is generated.
- ✓ Increased benefit history view Allow recipients to view two month prior, current and future month benefit status.
