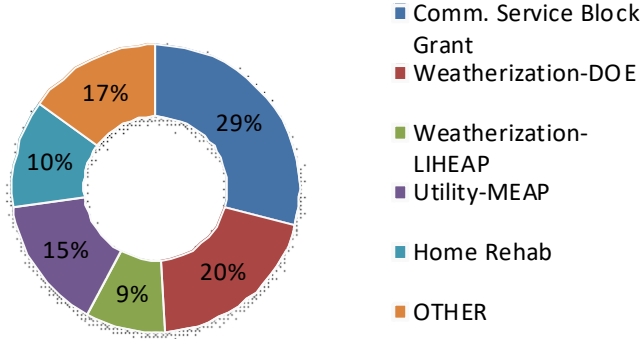


Ottawa County CAA exists to reduce the effects of poverty by promoting self sufficiency and economic independence.

Housing-Weatherization: weatherize homes to conserve energy use.	33: 31 Owner Occupied
Food Assistance: food program for SENIORS	374 households/month (seniors)
Food Assistance: food program for GENERAL PUBLIC.	869 Households/quarter
Migrant Services: emergency services for agricultural workers.	63 services/ 33 households
Tax Assistance: tax preparation for low-income, disabled, senior households	246 households: \$333,555 in refunds (\$1,356 average)
