June 5 10-11 AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>First Impressions!</b> Kids will explore how they feel about nature’s creatures including buzzing bees, cuddly rabbits, sneaky squirrels, slithering snakes and beautiful birds. They may discover that their feelings about these creatures change as they learn more about them.
July 2 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Happy Trails!</b> Let’s get outside and explore nature. Being prepared will make the experience even more fun. This session is designed to introduce kids to the basics of trail safety, and the “tools of the trade” including magnifying glasses, binoculars, maps and more.
August 6 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Butterfly Safari!</b> This time of year, the meadow is full of colorful butterflies flitting from flower to flower. Discover how the butterflies got to the meadow, what they are doing there, and see these amazing creatures up close as we enjoy a hike through their habitat.

June 11 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Wildlife Water Safari!</b> Let’s go on safari to see who lives in the wet meadow and river. Wear clothes and shoes that can get wet; we’ll wade ankle deep to get a close up view of aquatic creatures and their underwater world.
June 25 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Nature Detectives!</b> Nature offers lots of clues to tell us what’s there even before we see it. Using our senses and special tools, like binoculars and magnifying lenses, we’ll discover the amazing plants and creatures that make Hemlock Crossing their home.

July 9 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Terrific Trees!</b> Trees give us shade, food, oxygen, and so much more. How do they do it? Find out as we explore the wide variety of trees at Hemlock Crossing.
July 23 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Magic Meadow!</b> Let's walk the trails and discover the colorful variety of flowers, birds, and insects that can be seen in the meadow this time of year. Will we see as many colors as are in a box of crayons? Let's find out.
August 13 10-11AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Insect Adventures!</b> They have wings, thousands of eyes, six legs, and exoskeletons. Are they super heroes? No. They are insects. We'll explore where they live, what they eat, and their amazing adaptations.
August 27 10-11 AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Hiding in Plain Sight!</b> Have you ever been surprised by a spider, or startled by a squirrel? How can these animals be so close, and yet so hard to see? Let's explore and discover the adaptations creatures use to stay out of sight.

### *Young Discoverers*

This camp is for **children entering 2nd and 3rd grades**. \$3.50 per session per child.

June 18 10-11:30AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Wildlife is Everywhere!</b> Wildlife is everywhere, but do you know it's there? We'll fine tune our nature detective skills to discover which creatures are living at Hemlock Crossings. Learn to use tools like binoculars and magnifying lenses, and clues like tracks and sounds to identify animals in a habitat, even when those animals are hiding.
July 16 10-11:30AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Backbone Bonanza!</b> Did you know that by looking at backbones and skulls, you can discover an animal's identity? Explore how these features of an animal's body tell us more about where they live, what they eat, and how they move about. Through hands on exploration of the nature center's collection of animal bones and skulls, we'll learn more about the amazing creatures of Ottawa County.
July 30 10-11:30AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Super Seeds!</b> How does a tiny seed turn into a giant tree? Where do seeds come from and how do they move if they don't have legs? How does a seed carry its own food? What do seeds need to grow? Learn the answers to these questions and more as we take a close-up look at seeds and the super things they do to create the plants that animals and people need to survive.
August 20 10-11:30AM	Hemlock Crossing	<b>Show Me the Energy!</b> What did you have for lunch? Whether it was a sandwich or vegetable soup, your lunch somehow came from energy provided by the sun. Join us to learn how plants capture the sun's energy and turn it into food animals and people can use. We'll explore Hemlock Crossings to find some common and unusual plants and discover the connections between plants and the animals that use them for energy.
