PROCEEDINGS

WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Welcome to Holland Township. I appreciate you gentlemen taking the time to come and listen to what we have to talk about this morning.

This is for the public hearing for the Garden

Avenue Drain. I'll do introductions. My name is Joe Bush,

I'm your Ottawa County Resources Commissioner, used to be

drain commissioner. I changed the name when I got elected in

2012 because I felt like water resources is more what we do,

not just drains, so this is just part of the process.

We have Jerry Olman from the road commission, he's here to join us today. We have the township supervisor Don Komejan. We have my secretary, Jennifer, who does great work and she keeps track and makes sure I do these right, because I do a lot of these.

Everything is court recorded today, so Margie is our court reporter, so everything is word for word. We have an agenda that there will be a time for public comment. Make sure you state your name, address, your concerns or any questions that you have when that's addressed at that time on the agenda.

So if you want to see these at any time, they're on my website. It's usually about four to six weeks, Margie

gets it to me. And then if you don't have a means to access the internet or a computer, I'd be more than happy, if you call me and I'll send you a hard copy too. I don't have a problem doing that.

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So everything is court recorded word for word so that way you can always go back and reference it.

Something else, we have -- Ken Bosma usually does a lot of these for me from Prein & Newhof. He had a family emergency this morning, and he's heading for Chicago.

So we have Lucas who is filling in and Lucas has done several, not BODs, but he's working with Ken on these projects. And Lucas has been out here so he can identify what he saw, any issues that have come up when he's out there.

But he'll do a presentation on the agenda later and he can fill you in on any questions that you may have. And since Ken is not here, my apologies, but if you have further questions, we can get Ken in contact with you and we can further that discussion later.

And then also what we do in these public hearings,

I pick a -- I appoint or pick a three-panel board that have
experience on drainage, drain districts, township
regulations. There is a lot to being on the board, not just
pick three people out there and go, okay, can you do this and
say yes or no.

I make sure these people have experience, expertise in drain code or drain law or township or municipality assessments. There is a lot to it. And these three particular gentlemen are the ones I picked for this particular drain today.

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And we'll go from right to left, we have Todd
Wolters from Olive Township, we have Jerry Hunsburger from
Park, and then we got Glenn Nykamp from Zeeland.

So these three men have no affiliation with this drain district, Holland Township or any properties neighboring this particular drain known as Garden Avenue.

So they don't have any investments whatsoever and any reason other than to see if this needs to be established as a county drain.

The reason we're here is because it's an orphan. Holland Township, Don Komejan can talk later if he wants about orphan drains. We're doing it all over the county and we're establishing natural water courses that are nobody's. They're not the road commission, not the townships, not the counties. So when maintenance arises, I get the call, hey Joe, can you take care of it?

Well I can't. Number one, I don't have an easement; number two, it's not a county drain; and number three, I don't know whose it is.

And we can get into orphans if you have more

questions, we could talk all day long on orphan drains.

But Holland has 90 plus orphans that we're routinely going through these BODs and establishing, so then if there is an issue, if a business calls and says my parking lot is flooding or my business has water, you can call me and I can get my contractor out there immediately and we can fix it and find out what the problem is.

Right now you call, who are you going to call? There is nobody to call.

We can look into it, but it's not a country drain. So that's why we're here today. These three gentlemen will decide that for us. After I give them the oath, they'll run the meeting, and they will have a chair, they'll decide who the chair is. And they'll be directed the questions from here on out, and then they'll contact me -- or contact me, they'll actually look over and ask me any questions that you gentlemen may have, or they'll ask the engineer.

So I'll give these three gentlemen the oath shortly, and then from there all questions will be directed to these three folks.

Again, they have no affiliation with any properties or any businesses here whatsoever, no investments.

So I'm going to go ahead and give these three gentlemen the oath and they'll run the meeting from there, thank you.

1	Gentlemen, please raise your right hand.
2	Do you each of you solemnly swear to faithfully
3	perform and discharge the duties imposed upon you as members
4	of the Board of Determination, appointed by the Water
5	Resources Commissioner of Ottawa County to determine the
6	necessity of drainage improvements in a certain drain to be
7	known and designated as Garden Avenue Drain in the Township
8	of Holland, in said county as required by law, gentlemen?
9	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: I do.
10	MEMBER JERRY HUNSBURGER: I do.
11	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I do.
12	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Thank you.
13	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: I'll make a motion to approve
14	Jerry Hunsburger being the chairman of this Board of
15	Determination.
16	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I'll support that.
17	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: All in favor, say aye.
18	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye.
19	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Aye.
20	MEMBER JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye.
21	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: I'd make a motion that
22	Glenn be the secretary.
23	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I'll support that.
24	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: All in favor, say aye.
25	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye.

MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Aye.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: The roles have been described by the Water Resources Commissioner. Our purpose is to listen to you, and ultimately make a decision whether or not this drain is a necessity.

In order to do that, we're going to give the township an opportunity if they'd like to to speak to the issue before us.

Mr. Komejan, do you have any comments you'd like to make?

TOWNSHIP MANAGER DON KOMEJAN: Just briefly, I think Mr. Bush has mentioned from our standpoint the township board has approved a funding policy to deal with storm drains that are particularly not officially county drains, so this is part of what we're talking about today.

So the township board has approved a policy that will pay for the establishment, bringing an orphan drain, if you will, into becoming an establish county drain.

This meeting and publications and other types of administrative functions have costs to them, and those costs will be actually paid for by the township as a proactive effort to bring these types of drains into the system officially.

So that part, I think is positive for the property

owners to work our way through where we are now and get drains established that can actually have a maintenance protocol and an improvement protocol and funding protocol, once we get to that point.

Beyond that, once a drain is officially established as a county drain district and drain, then we will work our way through whatever maintenance and improvements may be desired or necessary as determined by the needs of the property owners.

Those costs, if they're under roughly about \$10,000 annually, the township budgets to pay for those kinds of expenses.

Once they pass that threshold, then we typically look at a cost sharing that would involve usually the township, potentially the road commission, and potentially property owners that are benefited.

But that part of it does not really get determined before the needs and kind of determinations of improvements are identified.

So just a kind of quick overview of this step, this step is a step that the township supports, you know, moving orphan drains into declared county, official county drains and we're providing funding to make that happen.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Thank you, Mr. Komejan.
The next, in Mr. Bosma's absence, let me ask

representatives from Prein & Newhof, is it Lucas?

MR. LUCAS TIMMER: Yes, it is.

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CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Any comments or review you'd like to do?

MR. LUCAS TIMMER: Yes, I have a presentation I'd like to give.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Fine.

MR. LUCAS TIMMER: Once again my name is Lucas
Timmer, I am an engineer with Prein & Newhof and I assisted
Ken Bosma in some of the preliminary engineering work that
needed to be done prior to this Board of Determination. So
let's begin with Garden Avenue Drain.

Garden Avenue was petitioned by Holland Charter

Township on August 1, 2016 under Chapter 4 of the Michigan

Drain Code of 1956 to establish a county drain.

The reason why Holland Charter Township petitioned for this to become an established county drain is that this drain system is an orphan system, as we've been mentioning a lot. An orphan system means that there is no local or county governmental jurisdiction, which means then that there is no administrative or procedural or funding mechanisms in place for drain maintenance and improvement.

So if a storm sewer were to collapse, without it being an established county drain, Joe can't come in then and fix that drain. An example would also be if there is a lot

of brush in an open drain, or if there is a tree that fell in an open drain, without that being an established county drain, that's on the property owner then to take care of that, if it's not established.

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So here is the drainage district, the red boundary is drainage district boundary. And a drainage district essentially is a watershed. So the runoff within this drainage district will flow and eventually get into the infrastructure of this Garden Avenue Drain.

The way we delineate drainage districts is using three different tools, the first tool being county contour, GIS data. The second tool being development plans. So this is important for roadways to look at previous sanitary sewer or water main or storm sewer plans just to locate high spots in roads. The third thing that's most important in these developed areas are development plans, whether that be developments that have already been developed, or future development plans. And we do look at future development plans to see where runoff is intended to go when that land is developed.

So we have storm sewer located here (indicating).

We've got some storm sewer in Greenway Drive, two different sections here (indicating). We have some located here on Garden Ave (indicating). And then we also have some storm sewer on Lakewood Boulevard (indicating) and on Crossings

Court (indicating) that we're looking at establishing as 1 county drains. 2 3 We also have two detention ponds located here and here (indicating), and then we also have some open drain 4 5 located here (indicating). And we are looking at establishing these as a county drain. 6 7 So this is an aerial map of the drainage district, and also shows an infrastructure of the drainage district. 8 9 And currently we're not aware of any significant issues, and we will have time at the end for you guys to bring up if you 1.0 11 know of any concerns or issues regarding the districts or 12 regarding the infrastructure. We'll have a time for 13 questions at the end of this presentation. 14 So let's move on next to the branch, Drain Number The branch at Drain Number 29 was petitioned by Holland 15 16 Charter Township on August 21, 2016. CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Excuse me, Lucas. 17 18 MR. LUCAS TIMMER: Yes? CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: I don't want to 19 20 interrupt you. Can we hold that, because we're going to have 21 a separate hearing on that. MR. LUCAS TIMMER: That's fine, we can do that 22 23 presentation later. 24 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Let's just focus on the Garden. 25

6	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Thank you.					
7	With that, as we go to public comment, I'd like to					
8	have on the record a motion by our panel here to limit public					
9	comment to three minutes per person.					
10	Can I have that motion please?					
11	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I'll make that motion.					
12	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Support.					
13	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Any comment?					
14	All in favor say aye.					
15	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye.					
16	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye.					
17	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Aye.					
18	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: As we go to public					
19	comment, as we said we'd ask that you please clearly come up					
20	to the podium, state your name and your address so it can					
21	become part of the record.					
22	Our goal is to listen to you and to hear your					
23	concerns. That's why we're here before we make any decision.					
24	So with that we'll start on this side of the room,					
25	anybody that would like to address the panel?

MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: Excuse me, I would.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Please.

MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: My name is Kevin Kammeraad, I'm with DFK and the address is 315 Garden Avenue, okay?

And I guess I have a question. First of all, actually DFK did a lot of the development work on this originally, and the detention ponds that are existing were created as part of the development and allowed for those to hold water in lieu of a lot of onsite detention.

So we want to make sure that for the pieces that are yet undeveloped, that would remain a possibility, number one; and so that those original agreements would not be changed.

Then number two question, those ponds were already via an agreement with the Ottawa County Drain Commissioner, easements were already created to the benefit of the Ottawa County Drain Commissioner. And I'm wondering with those easements already in place, I understand they are not the entirety of the system you're looking at here, but with those easements already in place, would those then be moved to the benefit of this new drain commission, or what are the logistics of how that works?

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: That isn't something we deal with.

1	Joe, can you speak to that?
2	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Yeah, Ken Bosma and
3	I, I know he contacted you and that will be incorporated in
4	the next phase of what we're doing.
5	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: So existing arrangements
6	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct.
7	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: will sort of be adopted?
8	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct.
9	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: And I guess where I want to
10	parse through that is reviewed, or potentially
11	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: We don't plan on
12	changing anything.
13	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: Okay. So you adopt them
14	basically rather than re-review those?
15	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: That's correct.
16	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: Okay. And then secondly, in
17	terms of the use of that onsite, that will be wrapped into
18	the same discussion?
19	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct.
20	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: Okay. So any previous
21	agreements, any previous understandings would carry forward?
22	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct.
23	MR. KEVIN KAMMERAAD: All right, Joe. All right.
24	Those are my questions.
25	Thank you gentlemen

1	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Thank you. Anybody
2	else on this side of the room that would like to address the
3	panel?
4	Over to this side of the room? Anybody else that
5	would like to offer comment?
6	Then we'll close the public testimony.
7	I'm going to ask the secretary, do we have any
8	letters that need to go into the record?
9	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: No, we do not have any.
10	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Okay. So no
11	correspondence. We'll close the public comment section.
1.2	The board can now have our discussion and the
13	purpose of this board is to determine whether or not there is
14	a necessity for this drain to be established as a county
15	drain. That's the sole purpose of this panel.
16	So with that, based on what we've heard from these
1.7	folks and from the Water Resources Commissioner.
18	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Somebody
19	UNKNOWN SPEAKER: I guess I have a
20	misunderstanding, this is just on the Garden?
21	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: That's correct. The
22	29th Street, that's the second part.
23	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Looking at what we have here
24	I believe it's in the benefit of the property owners to have
25	an authority over the drain district for that emergency clean

out. We deal quite often where we have an orphan drain and nobody wants to take care of it, and we have no jurisdiction, not having any public funds that can go to a non-established drain. And then it's a matter of working between neighbors to try to let them figure out how to get it fixed.

So at this time I'm in support of putting that into a county drain.

MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: And I agree, there is no members here that were against this. It's what the township wants to do, and I think it's really a great idea for the township to do these kind of things so that in the future when things do go wrong, there is somebody they can go get a hold of and get it taken care of; whereby in our township we don't have that many drains to begin with, and orphan drains would become a real issue in the future.

CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: And my comment would be that this gives the Water Resources Commissioner, sometimes referred to as the drain commissioner, the legal authority to actually do something. And without this being established, even if he would like to, as he pointed out he has no legal authority or easements or right to go in and solve the problem. So I agree with what's been stated.

Did you want to make a comment?

WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: I did, I think John Baumann, I think his question might be related to a road

1	commission question because his business is right on the I
2	just don't want to skip him, but I think his question is
3	right on Lakewood.
4	His property isn't in so much the district, but his
5	water goes somewhat, when he floods into the roadside in
6	front of his building on Lakewood, goes into the road system.
7	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: So this is part of this
8	particular drain?
9	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: It is, right. So
10	he won't be in Drain 29 in the next public hearing, he is in
11	this one.
12	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: So let's take a pause
13	here, and please come up to the microphone.
14	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: My apologies, I
15	don't want to get the two confused.
16	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: I assumed he was in the
17	next one.
18	Can you please state your name and address for the
19	record, sir?
20	MR. JOHN BAUMANN: John Baumann, 11522 East
21	Lakewood Boulevard.
22	Back in 2011 when they redid the road, Lakewood
23	Boulevard, they made a high spot right in front of my
24	business, and they never put enough gutter in the road to
25	take care of all the water that runs through there. It all

drains into my property.

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And it's okay right now because the road is in rough shape, and the road has a cup in it, so the road takes care of the gutter today, that's not a problem.

But next to my property there is a ditch that runs to Chicago Drive, and really nobody knows the ownership of that particular ditch. So it's in what you're talking about, these drains.

I actually got a letter from a tree service right now that is going to trim some of those trees, but it is actually Consumers Energy easement is what it is. It is next to my building.

My building, the way the property is there, I can stick my hand out of the building and I'm on the next person's property. My building is one foot off the property line and this ditch is right next to my property.

And nobody seems to take ownership of this and right now it is so bad, it's just overgrown so bad that if we have a bad spring, it will be just flooding my property completely.

So that is really my concern. The road is -- the curb up in front of the property is getting so bad because of people coming in out of the driveway so much because the driveway is so narrow, and that was something that when they did the road, they could not make that ditch any wider -- or

1 the driveway any wider, and it is just getting torn up so bad 2 because of people coming in out of the driveway there. And I get all the water from the neighbor's 3 4 property that slants down into that ditch. 5 The ditch is very crucial to my business anyway of 6 keeping me from flooding because I've been flooded out quite a few times, but I've managed to fix things myself. But even 7 8 today there is a lot of pond water in front of the property because that's where I got to keep the water coming from my So that's what I'm concerned about. 10 property. CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Let's just ask a 11 12 clarifying question. Is his property currently in the drainage district or should be it be or will it be added? 13 14 MR. LUCAS TIMMER: So, John, is your ditch the one 15 right here (indicating)? THIRD ATTORNEY: Yes. 16 MR. LUCAS TIMMER: So that's located out of the 17 district. 18 It's right (indicating). 19 MR. JOHN BAUMANN: MR. LUCAS TIMMER: 2.0 Okay. MR. JOHN BAUMANN: It's on the border of what 21 you're talking about, because if they do anything on Lakewood 22 23 Boulevard, it's got to be concerned with my property. MR. LUCAS TIMMER: And does that run --24 MR. JOHN BAUMANN: Runs out towards Chicago Drive. 25

1 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Might this be caught in 2 our motion when we, later on, assuming we find the drain 3 necessary, we have a motion after that to expand as necessary 4 as they do final engineering? 5 WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: It could, correct. I think currently right now that drain goes to the south, and 6 7 is a different watershed. 8 MR. LUCAS TIMMER: Yes. 9 WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: But Lucas can go out and redefine it to make sure we didn't miss something. 10 11 And I know his issues also deal with Lakewood which is in the 12 drain district, so that's why he's here and got the 13 notification because his water does get from Lakewood on to 14 his property. 15 So because he is the low spot. 16 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Will this be a drain in the 17 future that Holland Township is looking at to -- I know 18 you're trying to incorporate all orphan drains to some degree. Is that another area in the future they'll be 19 looking at, or don't you know? 20 TOWNSHIP MANAGER DON KOMEJAN: That will be a 21 22 determination after investigation. 23 WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct. 24 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Depends on the final

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engineer?

1	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: That's correct.
2	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: It may become part of
3	this drain we're discussing, potentially?
4	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Or another orphan
5	public hearing in the future.
6	TOWNSHIP MANAGER DON KOMEJAN: Yes. But either
7	way, I guess eventually, if it's not incorporated in this
8	current consideration, it will become part of a future
9	consideration.
10	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: So we've heard your
11	issue and it sounds like if final engineering doesn't bring
12	it into this drain, it will have to be a future discussion
13	for another potential hearing.
14	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct.
15	MR. JOHN BAUMANN: Thank you.
16	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: But it also sounds to me like
17	when is that next one going to be? If he has issues now, why
18	can't we incorporate some of that into this, like that ditch
19	that's in there?
20	WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: It's hard to make
21	water run uphill though. If that water is already going to
22	Chicago Drive, we might not be able to make it
23	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: This is a drain that runs
24	between Safety Products and the old
25	MR. JOHN BAUMANN: Yes.

1 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: And that's full of a lot of brush. 2 3 MR. JOHN BAUMANN: And nobody takes ownership of I've cleaned it out before, but it's terrible right now. 4 5 It's not my property. 6 TOWNSHIP MANAGER DON KOMEJAN: So really we're 7 talking determination is does that fit into this water 8 drainage area? 9 WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: Correct 10 TOWNSHIP MANAGER DON KOMEJAN: Or does it have to 11 become part of one that is further south. 1.2 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: And that will be 13 determined by the engineers because again, you can't make the water run uphill. 14 15 WATER RESOURCES COM. 23	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: So we have a motion on
24	the floor to deem that this is necessary under the drain
25	code, to come under as a county drain. Any further

1 discussion than what we've had previously? 2 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Not here. 3 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Okay, then I'm going to 4 call for the question. All in favor of deeming this drain as 5 a necessity, please say aye. 6 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye. CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye. 8 MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: 9 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Opposed? 10 So we've declared it necessary. 11 So we have the opportunity for other motions, one 12 being that the drain is necessary for the protection of public health, and that Holland Charter Township, that a 13 portion of the costs should be apportioned to the 14 municipality at large to help share in any costs, future 15 16 costs. 17 Can I have a motion on that? 18 MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: So move. 19 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Support. 20 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Okay. Any comment? 21 And basically what we're saying is that if in fact there is a future need for an assessment, that we want to 22 make sure other governmental units including the township, 23 24 and I think that would include the road commission, the

county and so on would also pay a portion of it to help ease

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1	the financial burden, that's what this motion is about.						
2	I'm going to call for the question, all in favor of						
3	that motion say aye.						
4	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye.						
5	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye.						
6	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Aye.						
7	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Opposed?						
8	That motion passes.						
9	And we have a third motion if somebody would like						
10	to make that.						
11	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I'll make the motion for the						
12	necessary and protection of public health and municipalities.						
13	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Right at the bottom.						
14	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: I'm sorry.						
15	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: We need a motion that						
16	the drainage district boundary line be adjusted as necessary,						
17	that would be subject to engineering, and lands be added or						
18	deleted as determined by the Water Resources Commissioner, as						
19	determined by engineering, and that's what we actually						
20	discussed.						
21	Can I have a motion to that effect?						
22	MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: So move.						
23	MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Support.						
24	CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Any comment? I think						
25	we've explained what that's about. The preliminary hearing						

1 is done, once final engineering is done, there may be an 2 adjustment in the boundary line. 3 Further comments? All in favor of that motion say aye. 5 MEMBER TODD WOLTERS: Aye. 6 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Aye. 7 MEMBER GLENN NYKAMP: Aye. 8 CHAIRMAN JERRY HUNSBURGER: Opposed? 9 That motion passes. No further business to come before this board. 10 The 11 meeting is adjourned. 12 Any comments or questions you have for the Water 13 Resources Commissioner or engineer, please come up and 14 address Joe. 15 WATER RESOURCES COM. JOE BUSH: I just want to say 16 thanks for taking the time to come out and listen to the 17 public hearing. And the next process will probably be 18 getting easements where we don't have them and probably adapting maybe some more road system that's in the road and 19 20 getting easement from the road commission. But I don't see 21 any work being performed at this time. 22 But if there is issues, be sure to call me. You 23 know to call me and we'll look at them and get them resolved. 24 So thanks for coming. 25 (Hearing concluded at 10:30 a.m.)
